*If your child is attending the Shoreline School District with a boundary exception from another school district, it is not necessary to complete a new Shoreline boundary exception application unless your child is transitioning from Kindergarten to Gr. 1 (see Item 3 above). However, you will need to obtain a release from your home school district and return it to your school by **June 30, 2014**. The parent/guardian assumes responsibility for transporting the student to and from school daily or allows his/her child with a valid driver's license to drive to and from school daily. Continued enrollment shall be contingent upon space availability and the student's conformance with all school and district policies. Boundary exceptions may be revoked for the following reasons:

- a) There is no space available in the class, program, grade level, or school requested.
- b) The district becomes aware that the student's disciplinary records indicate a history of convictions for offenses or crimes, violent or disruptive behavior, or gang membership.
- c) The student's attendance records indicate a pattern of attendance problems.
- d) The student has been expelled or suspended from a public school for more than ten consecutive days. The student may apply for readmission on the same basis as resident students pursuant to Policy #3320.
- e) The non-resident student causes the district to experience a financial hardship after admission.
- f) The district becomes aware that the sole reason for the request is to support the athletic or activity interests of the student.
- g) Refusal to participate in mandated district and statewide tests.

Should your boundary exception be revoked, you have the right to have the revocation decision reviewed by the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction. Understand that under RCW 28A.225.230(3), you have the right to appeal the revocation to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.
